With nearly 250 full-time employees today, ATC is building toward a future where its people, products, and practices serve as a light in the industry and the communities they call home.

Founded by industry visionary Bill Fenech in 2017, Barletta Boats has quickly risen to the top of the marine manufacturing world. What began with a bold vision to rethink the pontoon boating experience has transformed into one of Elkhart County’s standout business success stories and a brand with global impact. In 2021, Jeff Haradine was named president of Barletta Boats. His leadership continues to build on the company’s strong foundation. At the heart of Barletta’s success is its remarkable team of over 400 employees. Their energy and loyalty are the result of thoughtful leadership and a commitment to workplace culture. One of Barletta’s guiding pillars is “win with relationships,” a belief that influences everything from employee development to customer care. The company maintains a dedicated customer support line, ready to assist with any issue, no matter how big or small. Barletta is also deeply invested in our community. Through its Community Go initiative, the company organizes four events each year to support nonprofits and local causes. Within the company, Employee Resource Groups focused on women, veterans, and diversity also host four events annually. Barletta Boats is always searching for ways to improve the boating experience, whether by solving existing challenges, simplifying the process for owners, or dreaming up features no one has imagined yet.

The manufacturing facility in Elkhart is the former Barger Packaging that was acquired in 2004. The company focuses on producing high-quality packaging using advanced technology, primarily serving the pharmaceutical industry. A family-owned and certified women-owned business, Colbert has 120 employees in Elkhart, and offers a stable, predictable schedule free from seasonal shifts. Their “Keep everything in front of our people” approach fosters strong retention, with events and regular awards for tenure and performance reinforcing a supportive workplace. The company is

also committed to sustainability, targeting a “0 to landfill” goal by 2030 with sophisticated sorting and recycling systems that capture every scrap of paper, down to literal dust particles. Colbert also brings this mindset into our community by running the TICCIT program (Trees into Cartons, Cartons into Trees), partnering with local second graders to plant trees and teach about paper production and recycling. Colbert has invested \$5 million in innovation over the past two years, boosting efficiency and output. Their facility now features cutting-edge robotics for packaging and shipping, robust and precise die-cutting equipment, and specialized machines.
