This milestone is not only a reflection of the Chamber's longevity but also a tribute to the 40 Chamber members who themselves have been in business for 100 years or more. These remarkable organizations—ranging from manufacturers and banks to service providers, family-owned stores, and community institutions—stand as living proof that endurance in business is as much about adaptability as it is about tradition.

Surviving and thriving across a century is no small feat. Consider the historical landscape: these companies have weathered the Great Depression, multiple wars, economic recessions, and the rapid evolution of technology that has reshaped nearly every industry. They've witnessed changes in workforce demographics, consumer expectations, and global trade. And yet, through innovation and steadfast values, they remain strong contributors to Elkhart's economic and social fabric.

Business Recognition Awards



ASA Electronics has received a Business of the Month Award from the Greater Elkhart Chamber Business Recognition Council. ASA Electronics was founded in 1977 by Tom Irions and Kelly Rose. The company develops electronics for specialized applications, and has been in Elkhart in the same location since their beginning. Tom is proud of Elkhart and its industry diversity. He has traveled to many places, and it reminds him just how lucky he is to be in Elkhart and contributing to this community. What began with two men selling things to businesses door to door to build up income has blossomed into a recognized company with over 100 employees. They started in the specialty manufacturing market and expanded into the commercial truck, conversion van, agriculture, construction, recreational vehicle, marine, powersport, and utility trailer markets. ASA provides a work environment where employees are treated with respect, teamwork exists, transparency is key, and the development of their staff is a priority. The culture that he has instilled is to ask the question, “What problem can you solve?” ASA Electronics is about customizing and being innovative. They have a fabrication division, engineering department, and a full testing lab to ensure client needs are met with attention to detail and quality. ASA Electronics has a foundation that gives to local charities and highlights them in the quarterly newsletter. Tom and his wife also serve on multiple nonprofit boards.

Quarterly Nonprofit Award

Heart City Health has received a Quarterly Nonprofit Award from the Greater Elkhart Chamber of Commerce Business Recognition Council. Heart City Health, established in 1993 as a nonprofit Federally Qualified Health Center, has been a cornerstone of healthcare in Elkhart County. Initially founded to provide affordable, high-quality medical and dental care to underserved residents, it has grown into a premier healthcare network recognized by the National Committee for Quality Assurance. With just 6% federal funding, Heart City leverages diverse funding streams to maintain flexibility and expand services, ensuring no one is turned away regardless of ability to pay. Over the past five years, Heart City Health has significantly expanded and found new ways to serve the county. The organization now operates four locations, including a dedicated women’s health facility and a fully operational dental center in collaboration with Indiana University Dental and Ball State University. The most significant community impact comes from their annual Health Fest—started 20 years ago—where they provide free screenings, demonstrations, and back-to-school donations, serving 600 people in 2024 with a goal of 1,200 in 2025. Health Fest is an event that truly represents what HCH strives to be for Elkhart County.

Business Recognition Awards

Logistick, Inc. has received a Business of the Month Award from the Greater Elkhart Chamber Business Recognition Council. In 1990, Tom Kanczuzewski faced a costly requirement to provide steel load locks for securing shipments while pursuing a contract with a furniture manufacturer. Determined to find a more economical solution, he invented the Loadbar®. Incorporated in 1992, Logi-Stick, Inc. later became Logistick, Inc. The company continued to innovate, and over the years, Logistick expanded its product line to meet the evolving needs of the transportation industry. The company carries forward the spirit of their grandfather's logistics business. Nick, who joined in 2011 to spearhead research and development, now serves as President, while Ashley, a member since 2004, operates as CEO. Logistick fosters a culture of care, prioritizing work-life balance and employee well-being. Regular company lunches and incentive-based team trips strengthen the sense of community. Employees are also granted eight hours annually for community service through the Cultivate Day program. Logistick's mission extends beyond logistics, weaving sustainability and community service into its core. Through their family office, LogiCan, the Kanczuzewski family invests in clean energy and solar startups, while their sustainability efforts include recycling 75% of plastics, six years of sustainability reporting, and a likely negative carbon footprint after three years of pursuing carbon neutrality.
